Where and when?

If your Midwife or Health Visitor suggest the **FOREST team** could support you:

- A Practitioner in the team can visit you in your home
- Invite you into groups
- Can meet you at other places in your community, based on the support we are offering to you and your family.



What the FOREST team do

The **FOREST team** help families prepare for a baby and manage the challenges of being a new parent. There are lots of ways they can help, including:

- Preparing for your baby
- Health and development of your baby
- Recognising and responding to illnesses your baby may have
- Groups and activities for you and your baby
- Feeding your baby and introducing solids
- Encouraging activity and movement
- Parental mental health
- Parental conflict
- Getting dads involved
- Finances and community support
- Smoking

Who are the FOREST team?

The **FOREST team** are a part of your midwifery and Health Visiting Services. They work with families who are expecting a baby and with new parents.

Health Visitors are Registered Nurses or Midwives who have completed a further qualification in Public Health.

Assistant Practitioners have a Childcare and Early Years qualification.
